

0-3's





This half term, Red and Purple Classes have welcomed more children, who are settling in and enjoying all aspects of nursery. We have been building towers using large and small bricks and counting as we go. The children have joined in with "squiggle wiggle", making wonderful patterns to music.

Our focus has been Spring and we have planted seeds and bulbs, watering them frequently and watching them grow. Following on from this, the children walked up to the Orchard where they always enjoy exploring the natural world.

We have celebrated World Book Day, St Patrick's Day, Mother's Day, Ramadan and currently we are busy making Easter cards and nests.

Our key texts and rhymes for this half term are: "We're Going on a Bear Hunt" by Michael Rosen and "Jack and the Beanstalk". Safeguarding

In line with Luton Council guidelines, we follow very strict safeguarding procedures at nursery. Please let us know if your child has an accident outside of nursery which results in an injury or mark (cuts/bumps/bruises, etc.), we may also speak to your child if it is appropriate.

We also ask that you do not use your mobile phone for any reason whilst on the nursery premises.



Parking

Thank you to everyone who parks in a courteous and safe manner when bringing or collecting your child from nursery. Parking is being constantly monitored and has improved but we still have issues with cars parking across the gates to our car park, on the yellow school zig-zag markings, on the pavements and across our neighbours' driveway.



We appreciate how difficult parking is but appeal to you, and anyone who brings or collects your child from nursery, to park in the proper, safe and legal manner, showing consideration for others and ensuring the safety of all.

Reminders

- Please ensure that your child comes to nursery dressed appropriately to go outdoors whatever the weather.
- Please make sure all your child's clothes are named, including outdoor coats, hats, scarves and gloves (their name written on the label is good enough!). It is often a good idea to put gloves on elastic through your child's coat sleeves.
- Please bring a bag with at least one full spare change of clothes in case of accidents this can be left at nursery.
- Please ensure that your child does not bring in toys from home; it is always upsetting for them if they get lost or broken and they are safer at home.
- Please do not open the gate to your child's class. For the safety of the children, the gates should only be opened by a member of staff.
- Please ensure that your child does not have any food, drinks or medication in their bags.
- Please do not put any foods containing nuts in packed lunches.
- Please name the outside of your child's bag.
